# I. Background

PAN ATLANTIC RESEARCH

- Pan Atlantic Research is a Portland, Maine based, **independent** marketing research and consulting firm which is currently in its 39<sup>th</sup> year of successful operation.
- This Omnibus Poll is the **64th** poll in a series of statewide polls conducted by Pan Atlantic Research on public policy, business, economic, and technology issues.
- Information contained in the Omnibus Poll is developed and intended for clients of Pan Atlantic Research, the media, and the general public.
- **The research conducted for this Omnibus Poll was not commissioned or paid for by any clients or other parties.** Proprietary research collected on other matters for clients (non-election issues) is not included in this report and is the sole property of those clients who commissioned it.

## II. Methodology

- The 64<sup>th</sup> Pan Atlantic Research Omnibus Poll™ was conducted between September 5<sup>th</sup> and September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- A randomly selected sample of 875 Mainers age 18 or older was recruited online using a panel provided by our vendor partner Dynata, a highly respected national research panel provider. Respondents who indicated that they were "likely," "very likely", or "certain" to vote were asked all questions on the survey, while others were asked only for demographic information for weighting purposes.
- Data were weighted using US Census Bureau data to match the composition of Maine's voting-age population based on Congressional District, age, education, and gender.
- **The result is a sample of 812 likely voters, with a margin of sampling error of 3.5% at the 95% percent confidence level.**

## II. Methodology

- The survey was administered only to those who fulfilled the following criteria:
  - Are “certain,” “very likely,” or “likely” to vote in the Presidential Election on November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024
  - Are registered to vote in Maine
  - Are ages 18 and older
  - Do not, nor does anyone in their household, work for a market research, advertising or media firm.
- It should be noted that figures may not always equal 100.0 percent due to the rounding of decimals.

## II. Methodology

PAN ATLANTIC RESEARCH

- The results are broken out by various demographic subsamples, including Congressional District, political party affiliation, age, education, income, and gender. The margins of error for specific sub-samples are higher than the  $\pm 3.5\%$  margin of sampling error for the entire sample.
- Finally, we note that as with all surveys, these results are indicative of public opinion at a singular point in time and do not seek to project final election results.

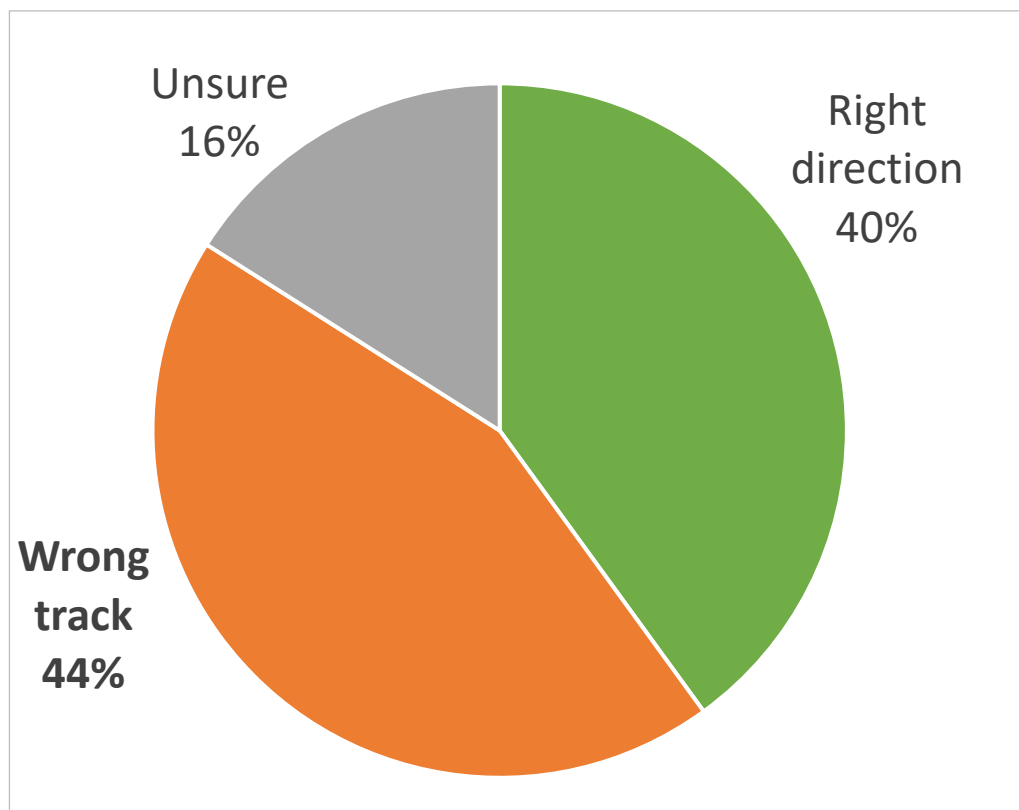

## National and State Political Climate

# Direction of the State

A plurality of respondents (44%) indicated that they feel that things in the State of Maine are off on the “wrong track,” while 40% feel that things are generally headed in the “right direction.”



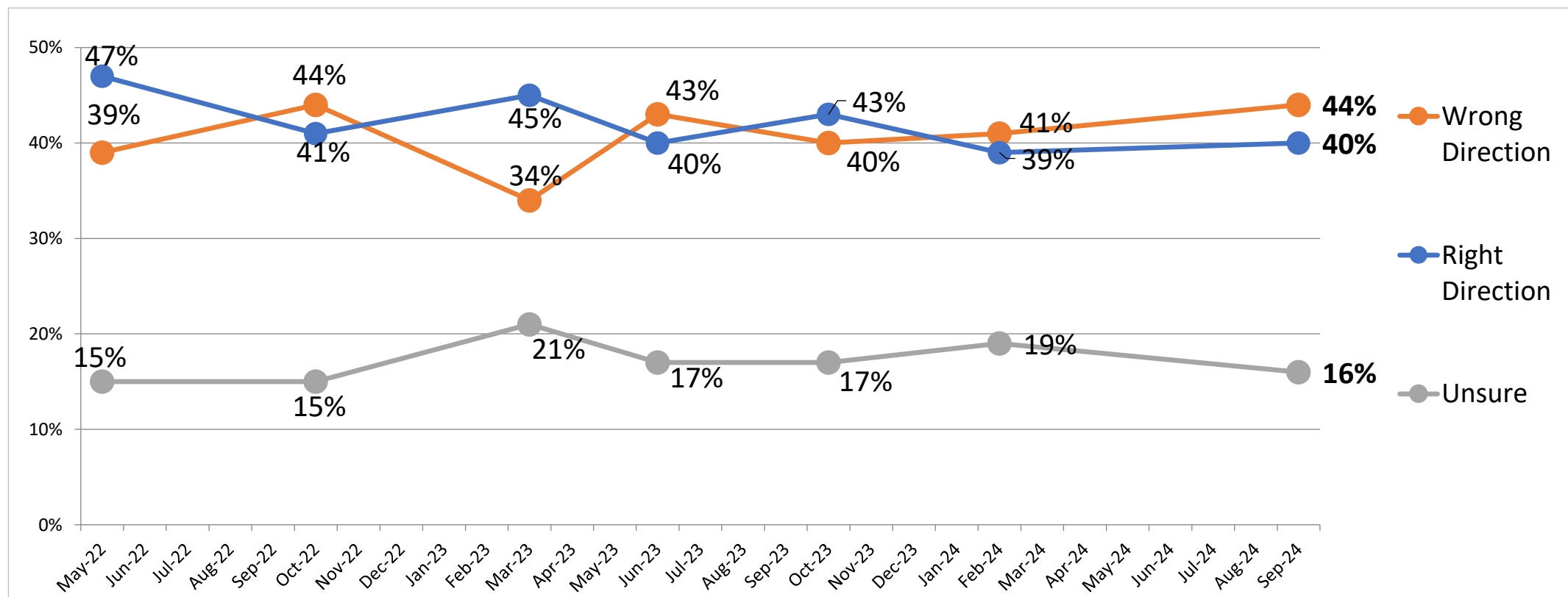
- 16% of respondents are “unsure” on this question.
- 69% of Democrats said that the state is headed in the right direction compared to 33% of Independents and only 17% of Republicans.
- 46% of respondents in CD1 said that the state is headed in the right direction compared to 34% of respondents in CD2.

# Direction of the State - *Trend*

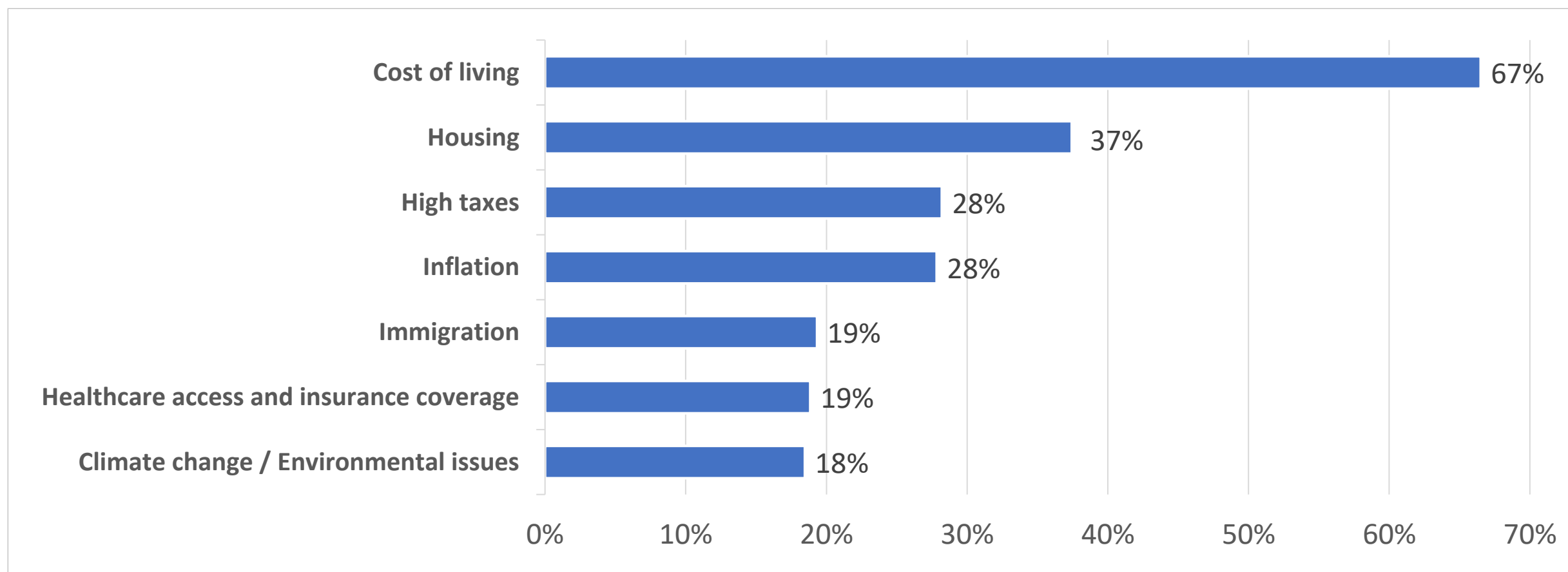
Since May of 2022, the proportion of respondents perceiving that the State is headed in the right direction has trended downwards from 47% to 40%.

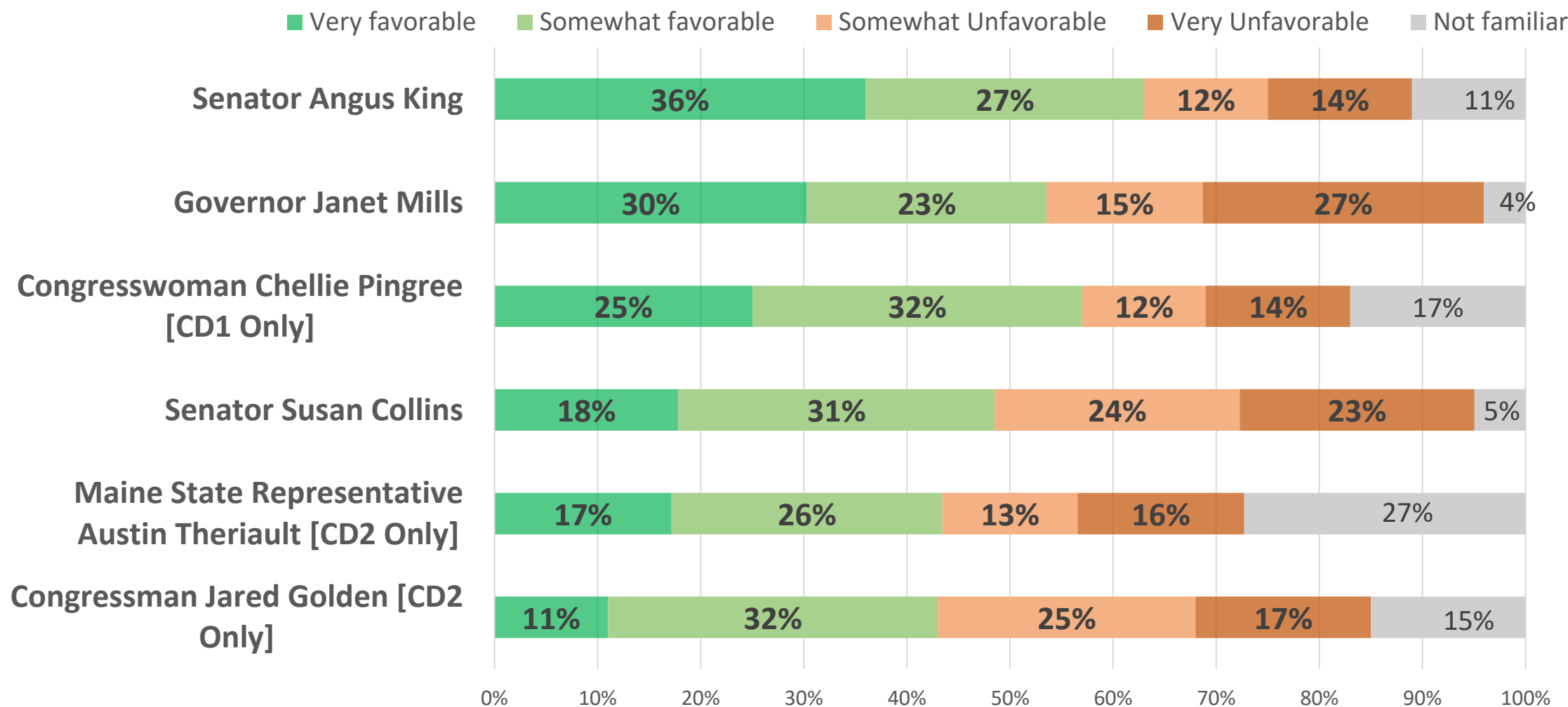
## Key Issues Facing the State of Maine – Top 3 Issues Combined

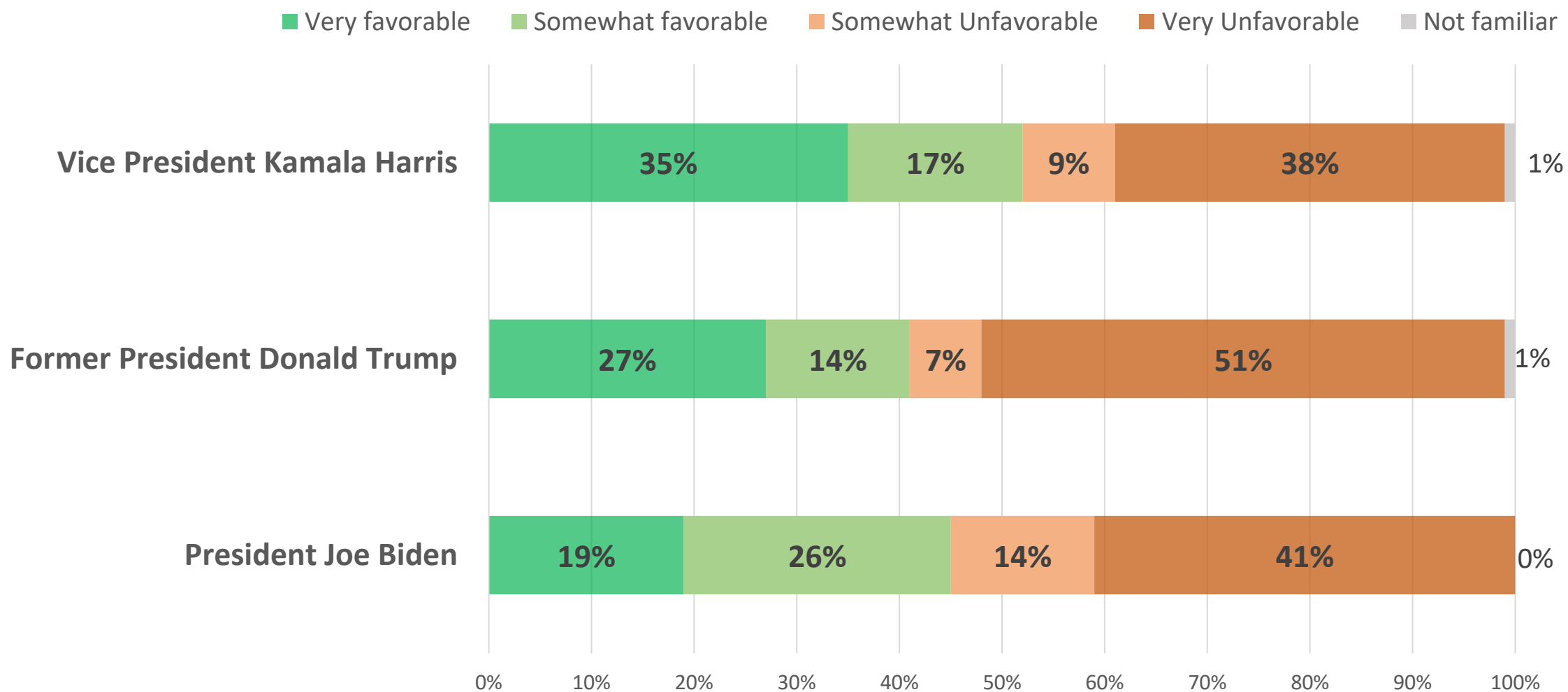

- All Maine-based figures tested have positive net favorability ratings.
- Net favorability for Chellie Pingree has increased by 12 percentage points relative to the February 2024 Omnibus survey.
- Net favorability for Jared Golden has decreased by 19 percentage points relative to the February 2024 Omnibus survey.

# Net Favorability, National Political Figures

(% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

Vice President Kamala Harris	+5
President Joe Biden	-10
Former President Donald Trump	-17

- Among national figures tested, only Kamala Harris has a positive favorability rating.
- Joe Biden has a negative net favorability rating; however, his net favorability rating has improved by 13 points from the level recorded in the February 2024 Omnibus survey.
- Kamala Harris’s net favorability is +16 in CD1 and -9 in CD2. Conversely, Donald Trump’s net favorability is -31 in CD1 and +0 in CD2.

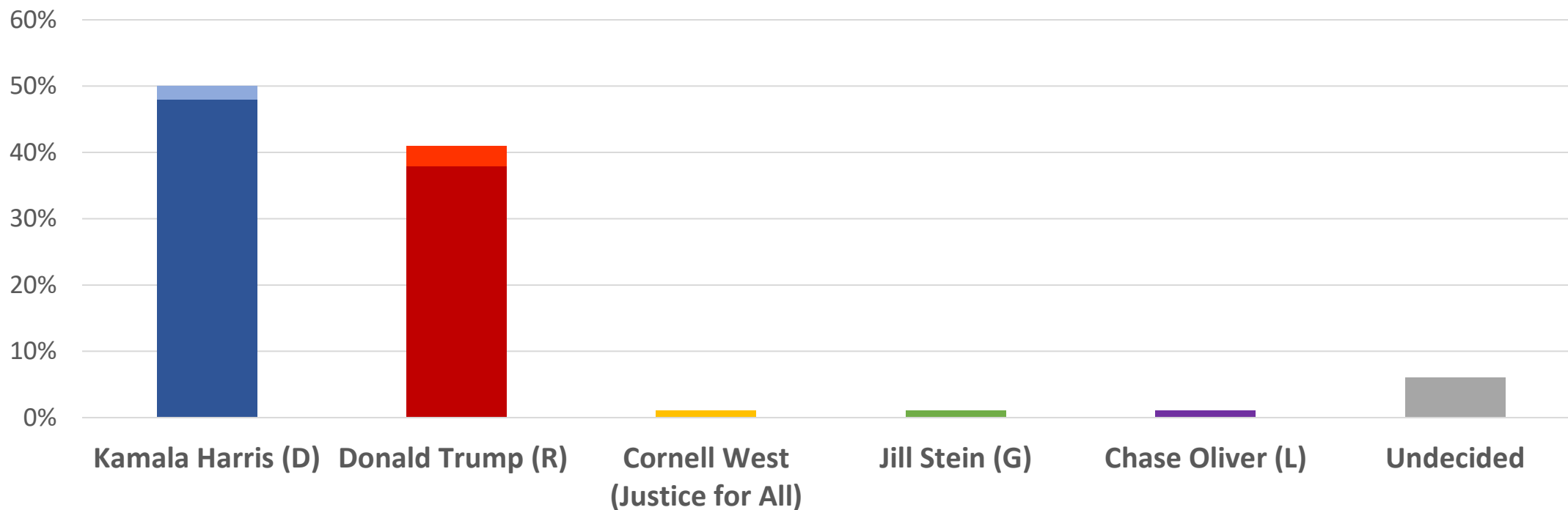

# Presidential Election

Statewide, Kamala Harris (D) is leading Donald Trump (R) by a margin of nine percentage points. Six percent of voters are undecided.



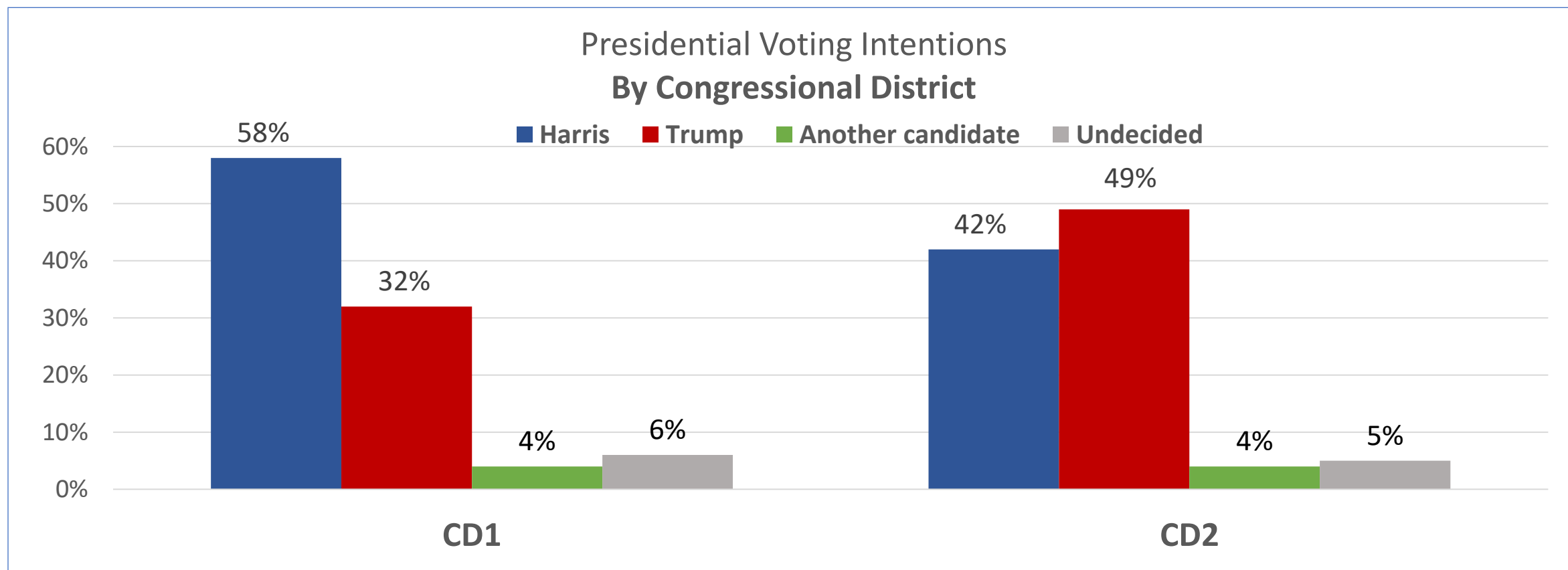

# Presidential Election – Key Demographics

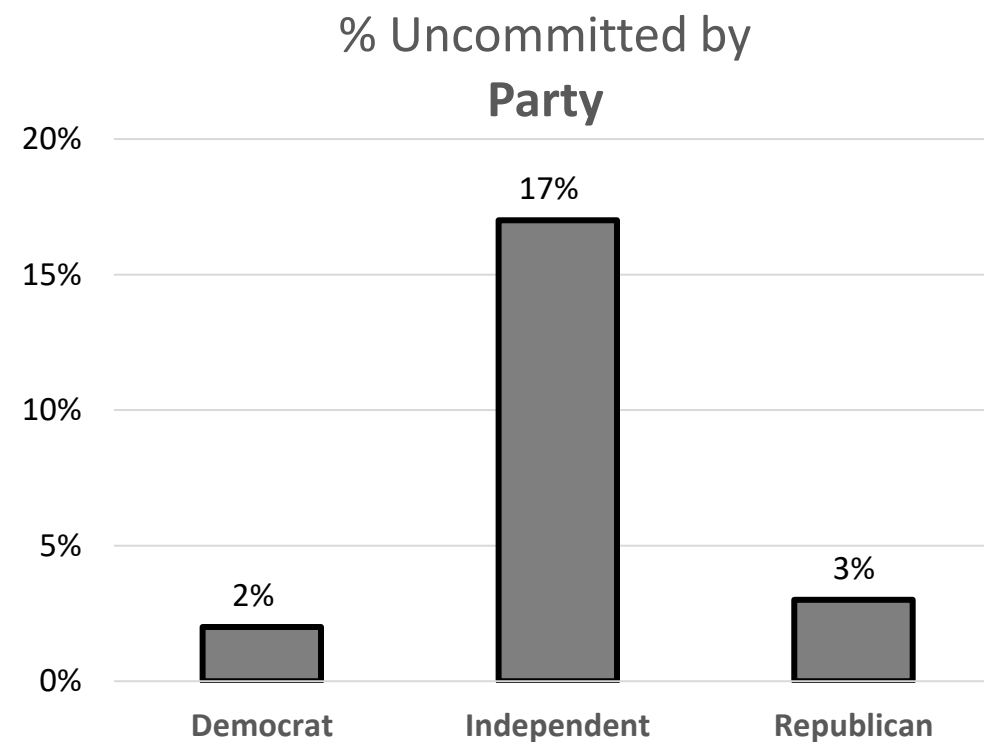
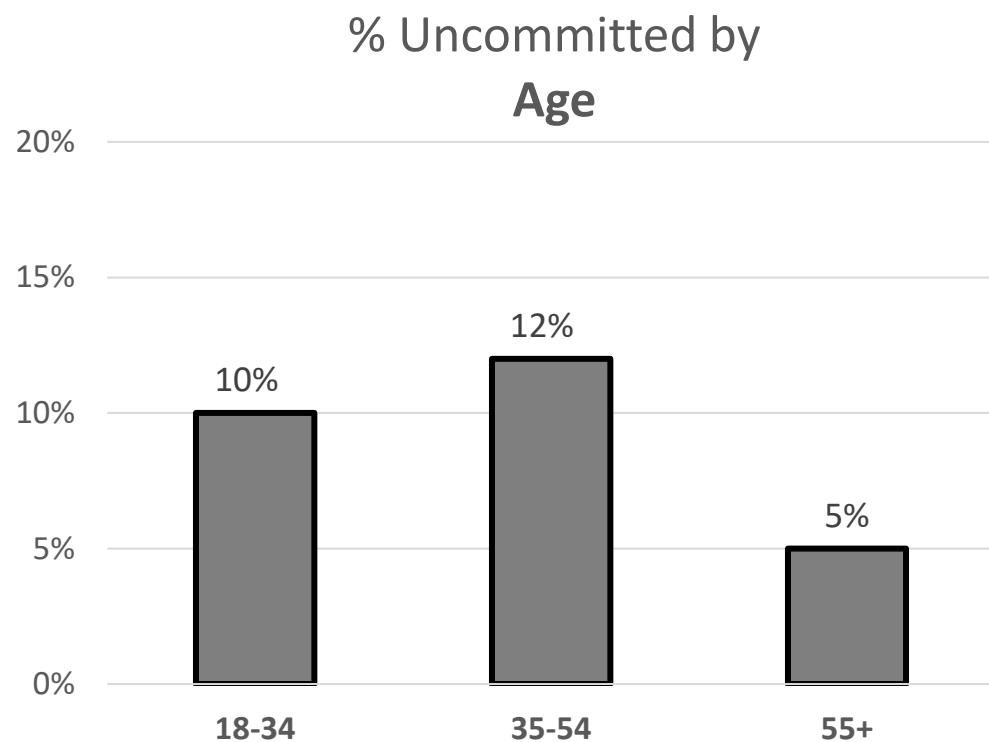

## Presidential Election – Uncommitted and Third-Party Voters

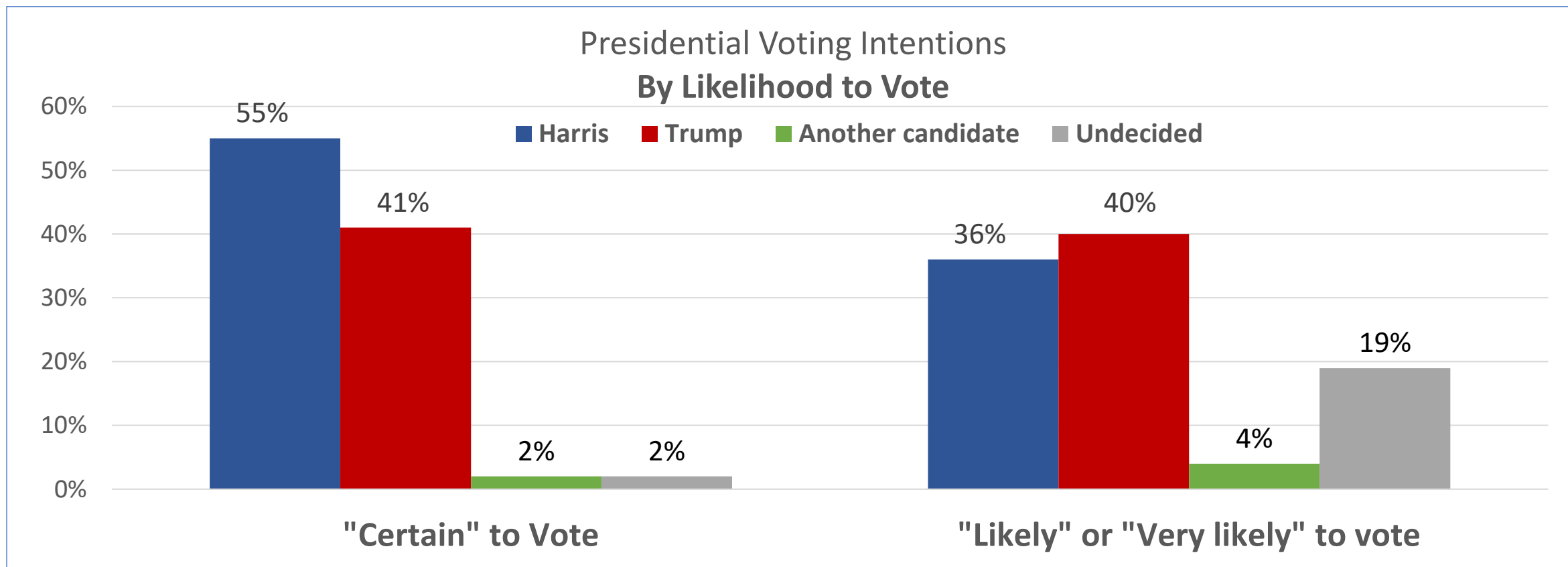

# Presidential Election – Key Demographics

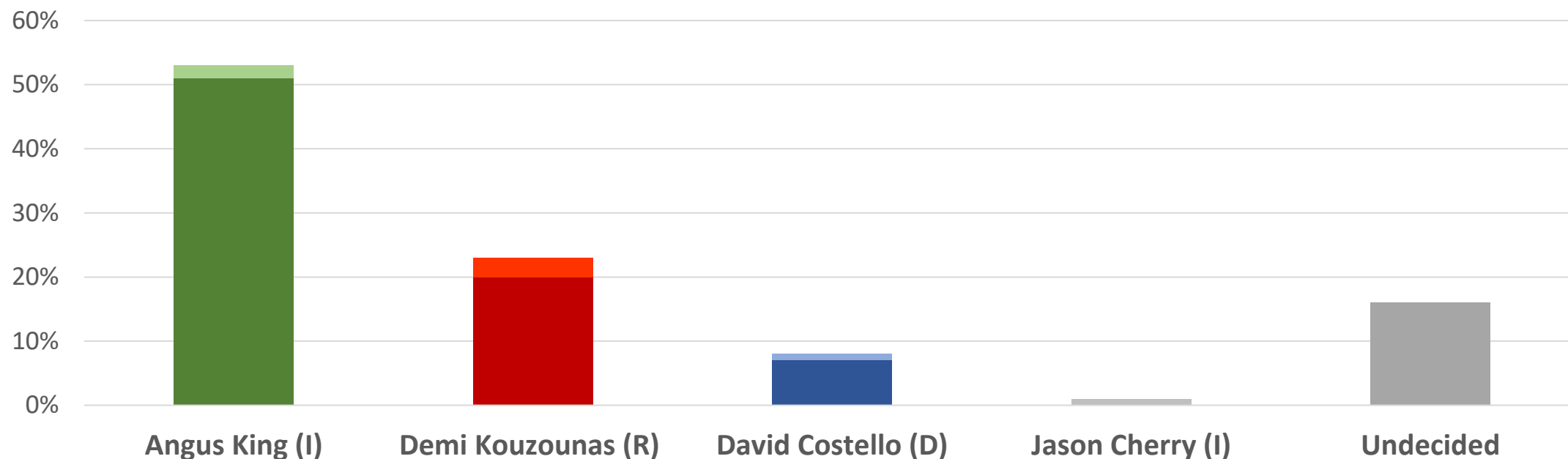
Among respondents who describe themselves as “certain” to vote, Kamala Harris leads Donald Trump by 14 percentage points. Conversely, among respondents who describe themselves as “likely” or “very likely” to vote, Donald Trump leads Kamala Harris by 4 percentage points.

## US Senate Election

In this race, Angus King (I) is leading Demi Kouzounas (R) by a margin of 30 percentage points. David Costello (D) is polling at 8%.

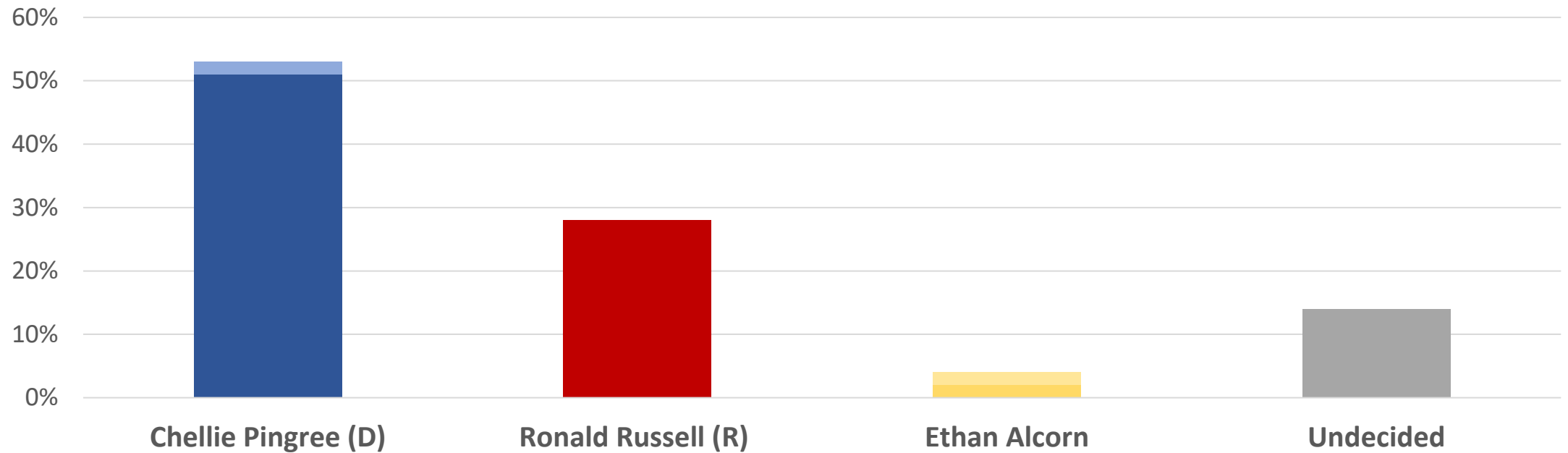

In this race, Chellie Pingree (D) is leading Ronald Russell (R) by a margin of 25 percentage points. Fourteen percent of voters are undecided.



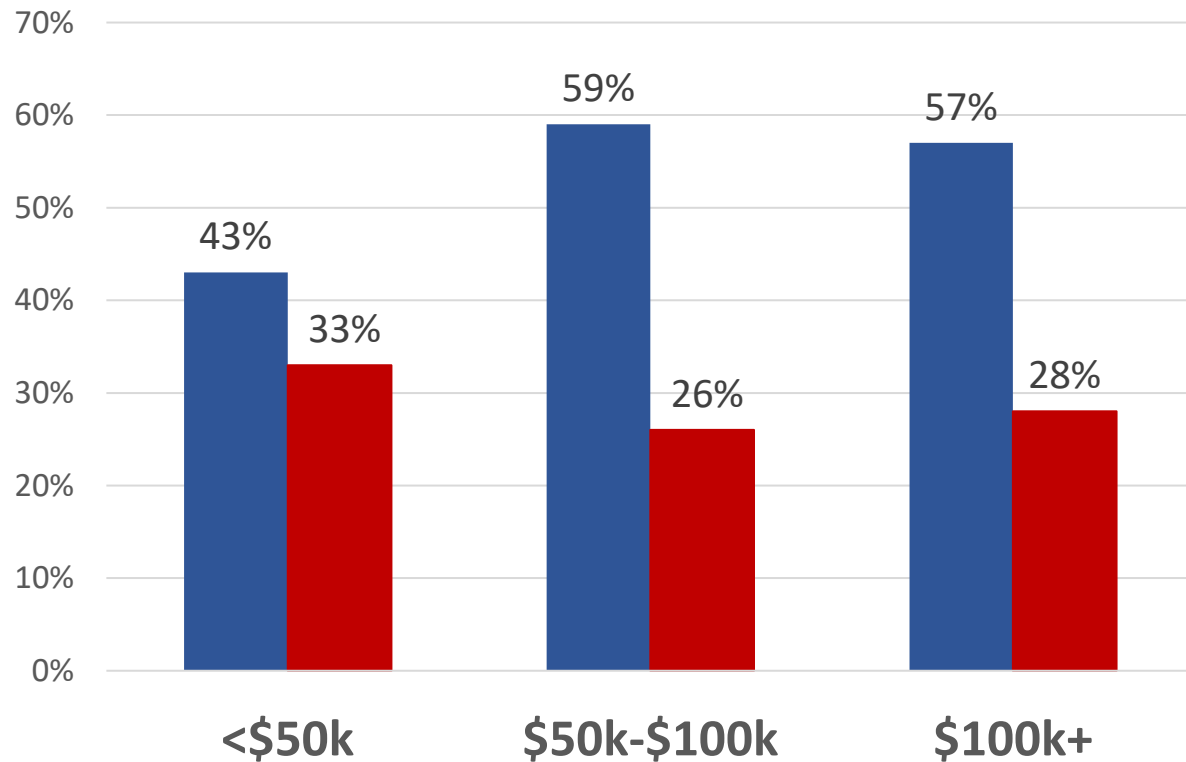

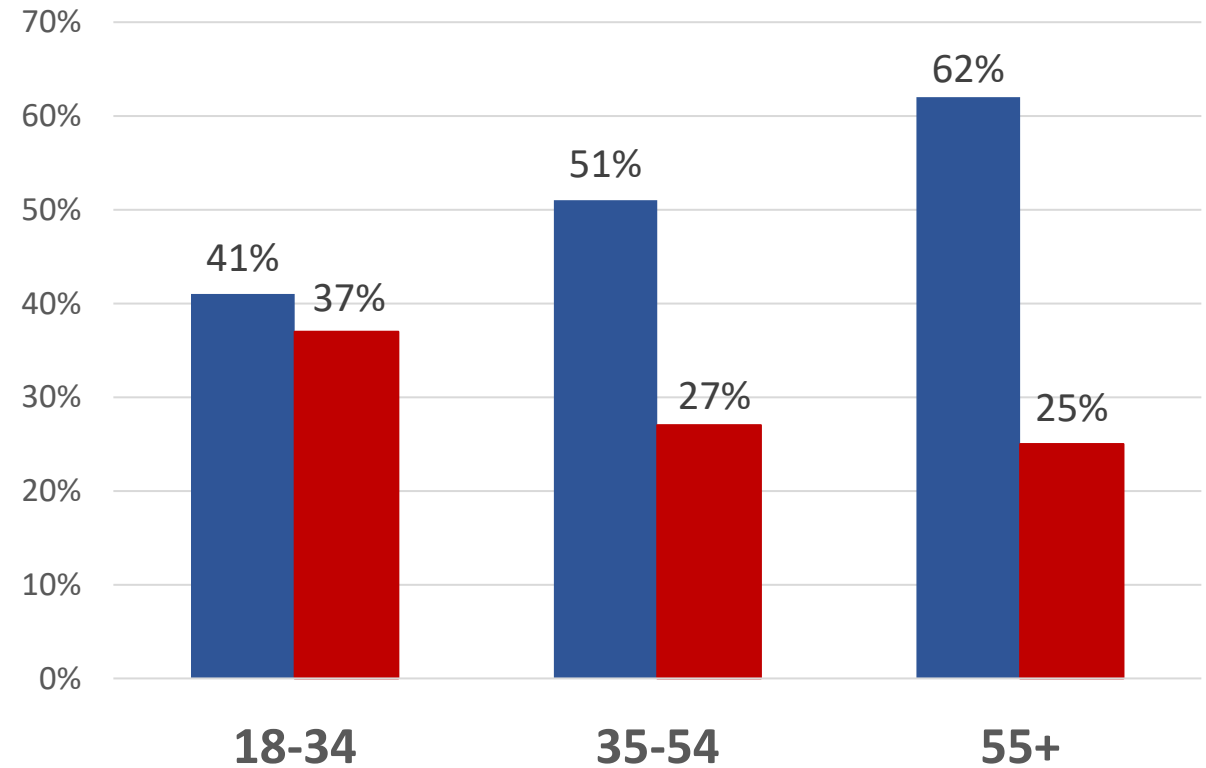
### Total Support by Income

### Total Support by Age

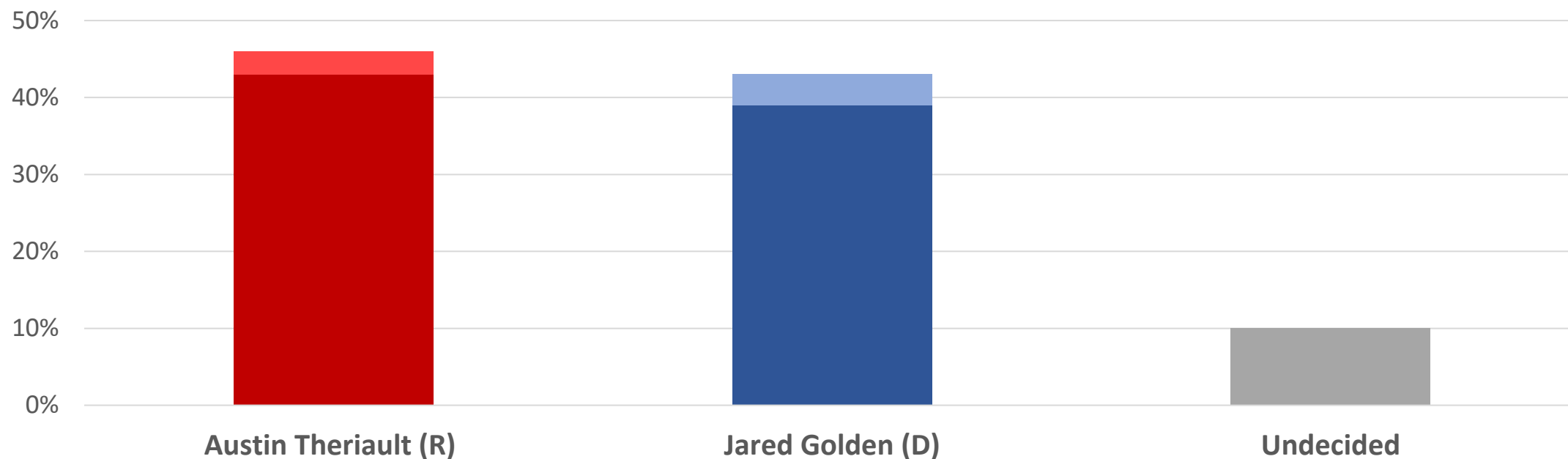

In this race, Austin Theriault (R) is leading Jared Golden (D) by a margin of 3 percentage points. Nine% of voters remain undecided.



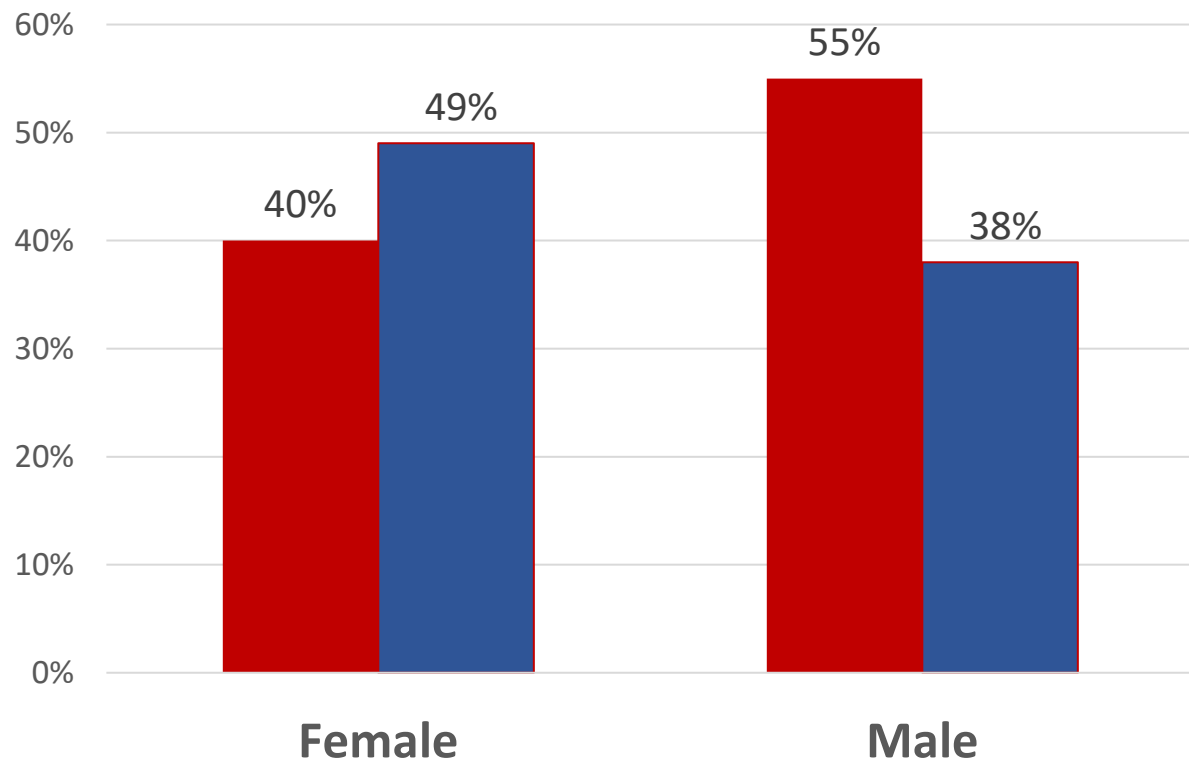

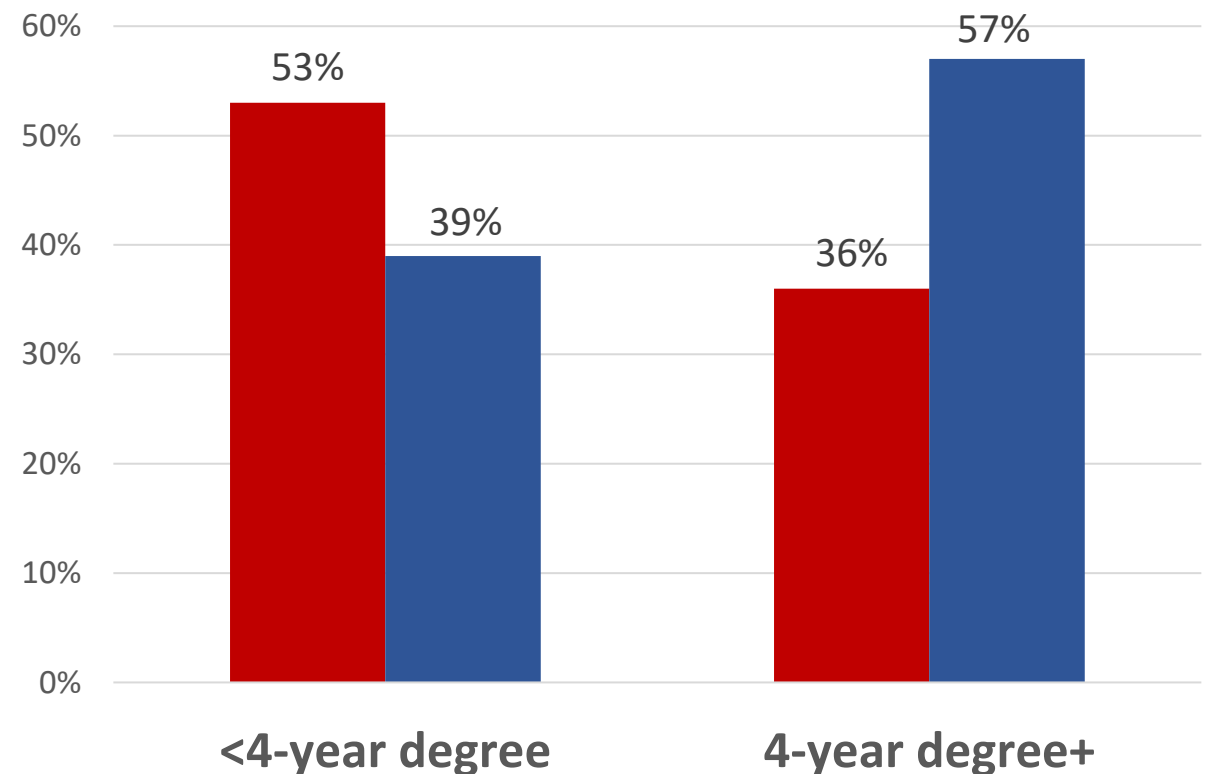
Total Support by **Gender**

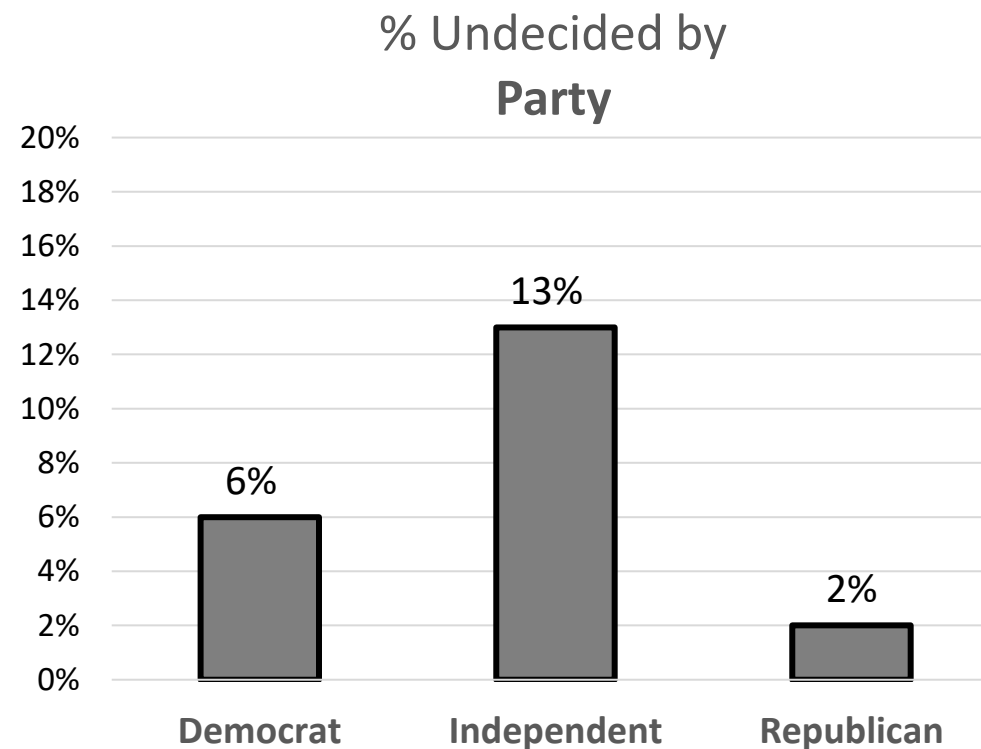
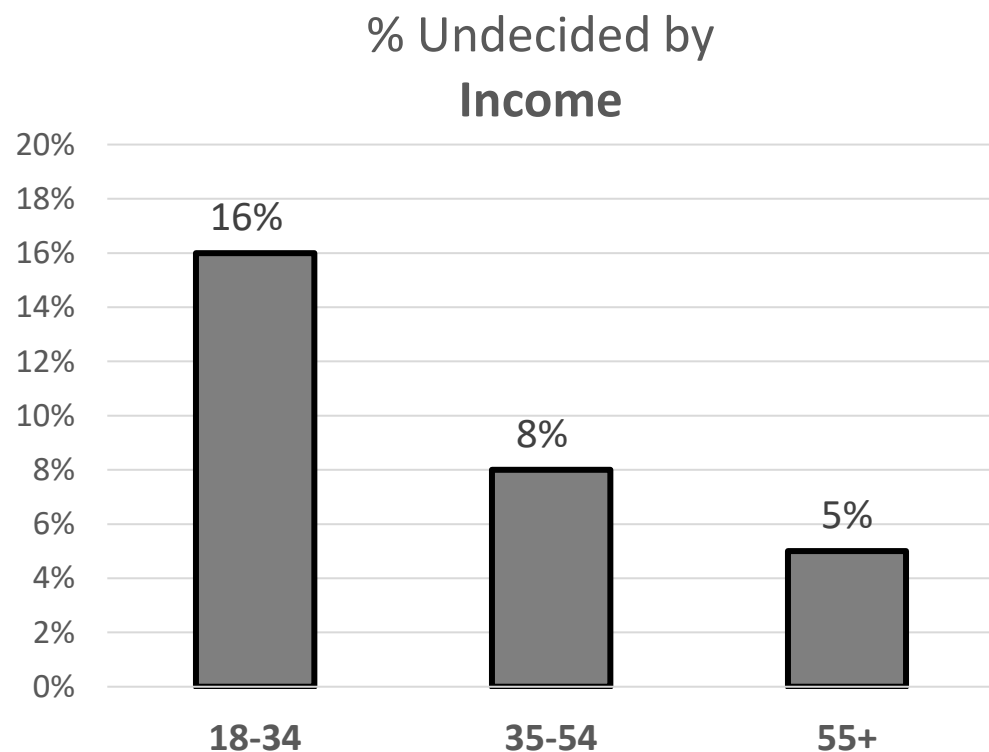

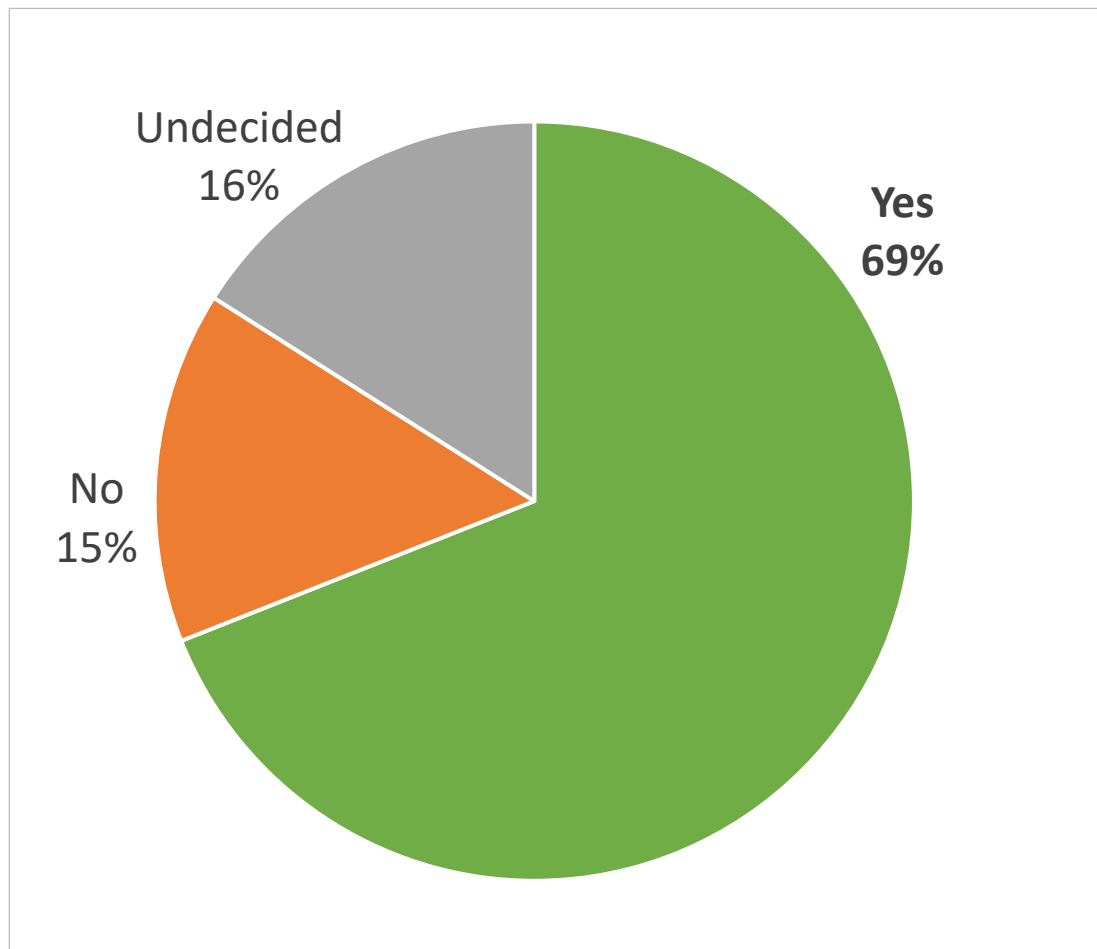
# 2024 Referendum Questions

---

- For each referendum question, respondents were shown the question text as it will be printed on the ballot and asked to indicate whether they would vote yes or no if the election were today.
- Questions were shown in the order in which they will appear on the ballot in November.

## Referendum Question 1 – *Limit Contributions to Super PACs Initiative*

“Do you want to set a \$5,000 limit for giving to political action committees that spend money independently to support or defeat candidates for office?”

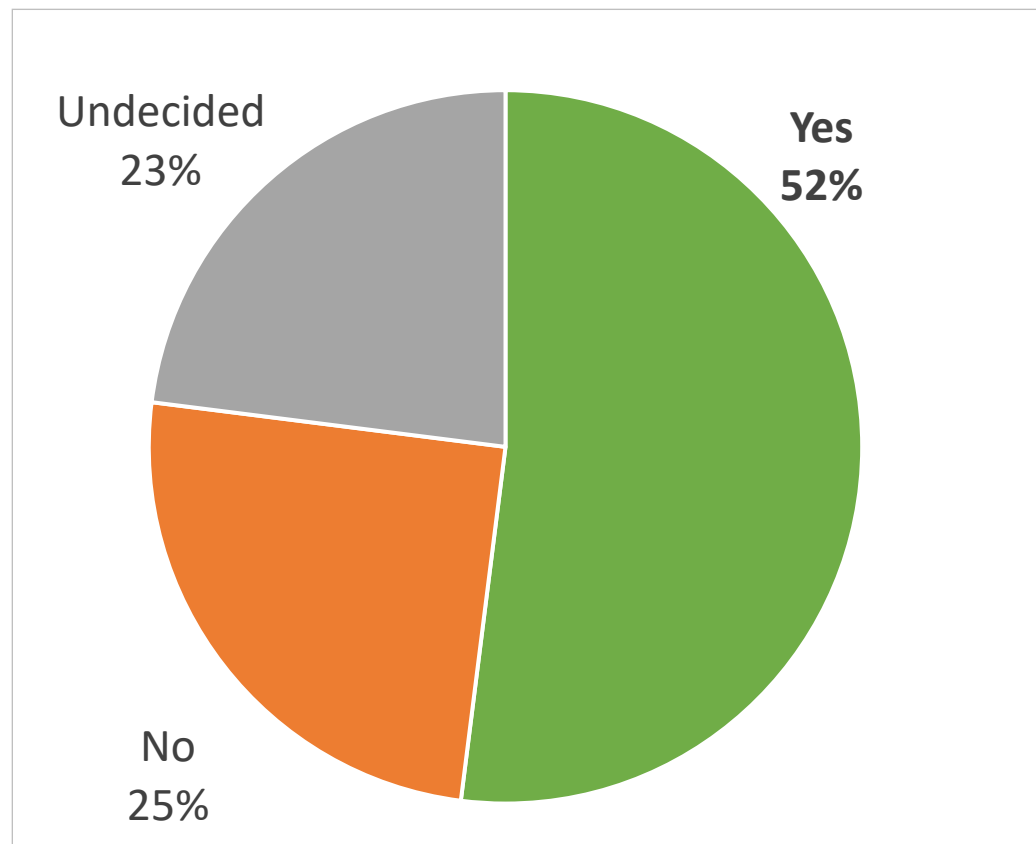


- A majority of respondents (69%) indicated that they intend to vote “Yes” on this question.
- 15% of respondents indicated that they intend to vote “No,” while 16% are “Undecided” on this question.
- 78% of Democrats and 78% of Independents indicated support for this question while 57% of Republicans did so.

- *On November 5th, Mainers will also be asked to vote on 5 statewide ballot measures. For each of the following 5 measures, please indicate whether you would vote yes or no if the election were today. QUESTION 1*

## Referendum Question 2 – *Science and Technology Research and Commercialization Bond*

“Do you favor a bond issue of \$25,000,000 to provide funds, to be awarded through a competitive process and to leverage matching private and federal funds on at least a one-to-one basis, for research and development and commercialization for Maine-based public and private institutions in support of technological innovation in the targeted sectors of life sciences and biomedical technology, environmental and renewable energy technology, information technology, advanced technologies for forestry and agriculture, aquaculture and marine technology, composites and advanced materials and precision manufacturing?”

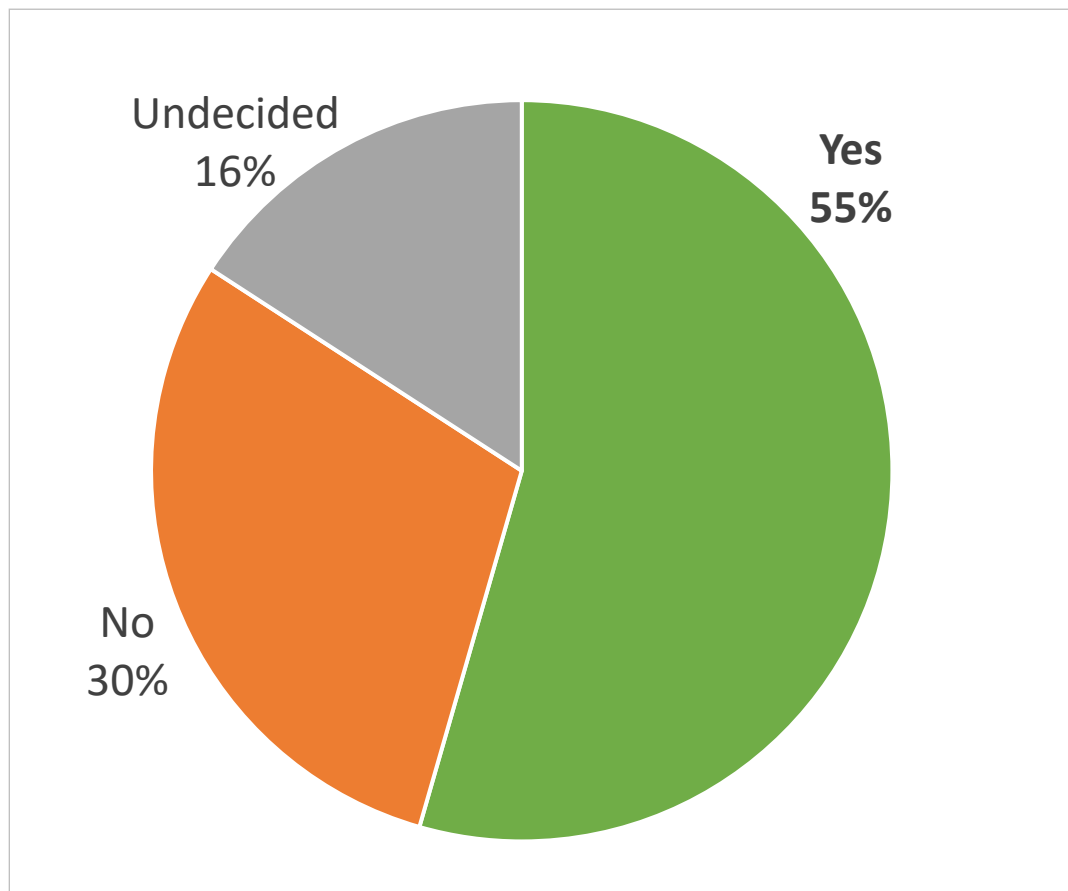


- Half of respondents (52%) indicated that they intend to vote “Yes” on this question.
- 25% of respondents indicated that they intend to vote “No,” while 23% are “Undecided” on this question.
- 67% of Democrats, 43% of Independents, and 38% of Republicans indicated support for this question.

- *On November 5th, Mainers will also be asked to vote on 5 statewide ballot measures. For each of the following 5 measures, please indicate whether you would vote yes or no if the election were today. QUESTION 2*

## Referendum Question 3 – *Maine Historic Community Buildings Bond*

“Do you favor a \$10,000,000 bond issue to restore historic buildings owned by governmental and nonprofit organizations, with funds being issued contingent on a 25% local match requirement from either private or nonprofit sources?”

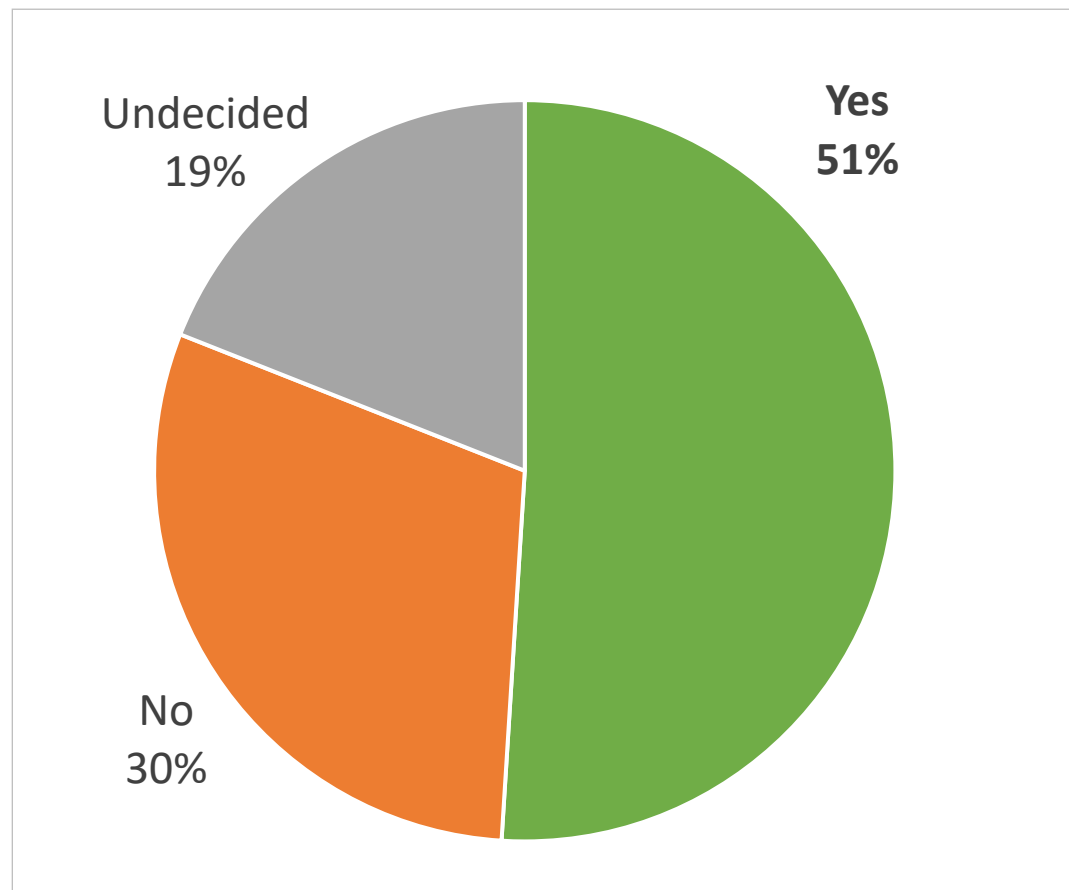


- A majority of respondents (55%) indicated that they intend to vote “Yes” on this question.
- 30% of respondents indicated that they intend to vote “No,” while 16% are “Undecided” on this question.
- 64% of Democrats, 55% of Independents, and 50% of Republicans indicated support for this question.

## Referendum Question 4 – *Development and Maintenance of Trails Bond*

“Do you favor a \$30,000,000 bond issue to invest in the design, development and maintenance for nonmotorized, motorized and multi-use trails statewide, to be matched by at least \$3,000,000 in private and public contributions?”

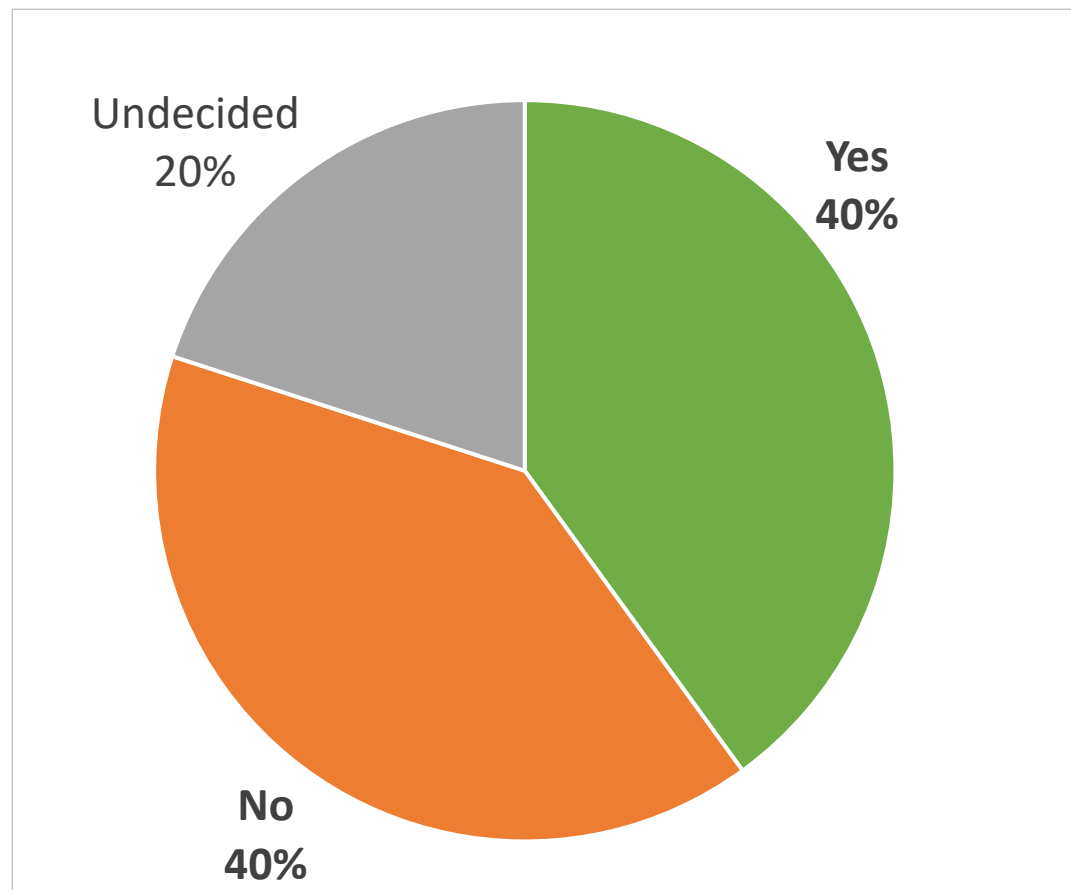


- Half of respondents (51%) indicated that they intend to vote “Yes” on this question.
- 30% of respondents indicated that they intend to vote “No,” while 19% are “Undecided” on this question.
- 57% of Democrats, 49% of Independents, and 47% of Republicans indicated support for this question.

- *On November 5th, Mainers will also be asked to vote on 5 statewide ballot measures. For each of the following 5 measures, please indicate whether you would vote yes or no if the election were today. QUESTION 4*

## Referendum Question 5 – *State Flag Referendum*

“Do you favor making the former state flag, replaced as the official flag of the State in 1909 and commonly known as the Pine Tree Flag, the official flag of the State?”



- 40% indicated that they intend to vote “Yes” on this question and 40% indicated that they intend to vote “No.”
- 20% of respondents are “Undecided” on this question.
- 44% of Democrats, 37% of Independents, and 40% of Republicans indicated support for this question.
- Support for this question was 46% in CD1 compared to just 34% in CD2.
